## Principal's Report / Sadhana Lad

## Teachers' Report / Jodi Rosekat

Request for Council to purchase a subscription to educateoutside.com, for kids aged 4-12 It's based on Cdn curriculum.
$\$ 200 /$ year Cdn for 3 month plus free trial. $\$ 20$ for 5 staff members, with limitations. Ali to ask teachers who wants to use it. MOTION to approve the $\$ 200 /$ year with caveat that at least 5 teachers will use it. Royce 1st/Michelle 2nd

## Rainy Day Games

Purpose is to give students something to do other than screen. Games must be about 20 mins to play. Primary classes already have non-tech activities so the target is grades 4,5,6. Examples include cards, puzzles, etc.

- Christy and Dee to provide Girl Guide boxes to hold games, rather than buy plastic bins, by early next week.
- We will add Rainy Day Games to the online auction
- We will ask parents to donate games and puzzles (with all pieces)

MOTION to give $\$ 350$ to teachers, to spend $\$ 50$ per bin for the seven classes. Amy 1st/ Christy 2nd. MOTION PASSES.
Janice (former Council member) has access to an ECE catalogue for a warehouse on Montreal Rd. DEE to contact her for Kinder and backyard scoops/skipping ropes/Skip-lts.

## Outdoor Improvement

Amy asked for information on why nothing has been done to improve the school grounds.

- The Kinder structure was removed by the City because it had expired, but the replacement falls on school fundraising. Agreement that we do not want a structure. We want open play.
- Board has ONE landscaper. He is busy!
- Shawn and Dave have a copy of the plan. Royce said we need to see it.
- Agreement that we need to find a professional grant writer, ideally a volunteer
