Principal's Report:

Literacy Initiatives: Closing the gap

The teachers at BCPS will be closely monitoring the development of early reading foundational reading skills (language comprehension & decoding) The development of foundational reading skills are key predictors of future reading success. Targeting literacy skills and overall development of students reading skills is a focus and has been a focus here at Bells Corners. Our primary and junior support focuses on targeted reading group instruction.

The District will be offering training to our staff for universal screeners for our youngest readers - k-2. We will be looking at DIBLES and Haggarty to help screen and give targeted intervention to students most at risk for reading difficulties.

We have encouraged staff to sign up for Reading Teacher's Top Ten Tools course offered by the district. We will be creating a focus group of staff members interested in this training.

Curriculum connections and hands on engagement for students with:

• two-part presentation on the sport of Lacrosse!

This program will teach us that Lacrosse is more than just a sport – through storytelling, videos and engaging delivery. We will experience connection to the land, traditional and historical underpinnings of Indigenous identity as it relates to Lacrosse, and how we now see and play Lacrosse.

The **first part** of this program will be presented to us virtually on **Thursday, May 12th**. We will learn about the history and origins of Lacrosse through an Indigenous lens.

The **second part** (**date to be determined**), will take place in person (at BCPS).

Classes will be learning key foundational skills of playing Lacrosse through activity. This component of the program is delivered in-person by skilled Lacrosse players. Students will participate in fun activities using Lacrosse sticks and balls.

- Scientists in the School are also being introduced in our K to 4 classes so far to date.
- Orienteering (grades 4 to 6)
- Little Ray's Reptile June 7th (k-3)
- Reading Buddies in Kindergarten is also starting as well.

Last week Junior students participated in a 2SLGBTQ+ virtual assembly. A District member of the 2SLGBTQ+ team discussed the use of pronouns, names, identity and the connection to the human rights code regarding gender identity and gender expression. At BCPS, we are planning to start a GSA for students.

Student voice and well-being directly impacts how students see themselves as active learners. Part of our student voice initiatives is our monthly virtual assemblies. BCPS students demonstrated how they achieved many of their learning goals during the assembly. Students also showcased some of their learning about the Earth Day and Eid ul fitr. (*Project video of Earth Day*).

Volunteers - huge thank you to all of the council members and volunteers who support our initiatives at BCPS. We are grateful!

The pizza kit fundraiser was a great success. Thank you to Amy for all her hard work. You appealed to the whole school community. They felt like they were contributing to the fundraising initiatives for the school.
