## Principal's Report - Sadhana Lad

The month of January was definitely off to a good start with high expectations for our students. Students engaged in continuing with our school improvement goal of literacy by engaging in a variety of literacy activities from phonemic awareness to decoding. The active view of reading is a guide for staff in their instructional approach with students at BCPS and the focus is to provide the tools to develop student's literacy skills. We have introduced one literacy tutor that takes small groups and we also have two math tutors that work on targeted instruction in the area of math.

BCPS have introduced intramural dodgeball and chess club to the list of extra curricular activities that are offered to students during recess. We also introduced Ottawa public health nurses into our school to honour discussions of well being to address mental health needs and ways to identify these feelings and how to manage and access support.

February is Black History month and students are engaging in many discussions about the contributions of many Black Canadians and educators continue to integrate a diversity of literature representations in their lesson planning. In addition, we have Kindness Day of Activities where staff will collectively complete an activity on integrity on Feb 16th.

# **Teacher Report - Marianne Tilton**

- Introduction of math and literacy tutors into the daily programming at BCPs is supporting teachers in delivering curriculum and supporting students with lagging skills.
- Teachers are putting final touches on report cards, which will be released to families next week. There are no official teacher-guardian interviews this term, but parents with questions or concerns can reach out to educators for phone, virtual, or in person meetings to discuss the report card.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

**Current Balance as of 4 Feb 2023**: \$25,459.80

#### Per statement dated 20 Jan 2023:

Closing Balance as of 20 Jan 2023: \$25,167.32 Outstanding cheques as of 20 Jan 2023: \$4,227.47

Approximate balance available: \$ 1,800 (unassigned funds)

#### Notes:

- The McMillians fundraiser has been deposited the amount raised was \$894.75
- Amount raised from fall pizza days was \$1253.88
- \$1,091.76 was provided to staff for classroom supplies to date, leaving \$408.24 available in the allotted funds if any additional staff wishes to submit receipts
- \$2,300.00 remains allotted for Scientist in School/Virtual Ventures, but there is room to increase the amount
- \$200.00 is also allotted for lice treatment in case that's needed
- For Pizza Days this winter, Council has been asked to donate pizza for 9 kids @1 slice (\$153.00 please correct me if I'm wrong on that, I believe it's \$17 per term). For recordkeeping, I have included this as an "expense" and the cost will come out of the totals at the end.
- The sports equipment (nets) will cost approximately \$90 more than initially expected. Elysa will let Council know and we will provide the extra amount to cover the cost.
- I was speaking with Leslie a few months ago and she mentioned that some schools manage the Council funds on their behalf. While this wouldn't alleviate the need for a Treasurer (I don't think) it may make it easier to find volunteers if there is not the requirement to do bank runs etc. Is this something we could consider? I'm not sure how much added complication it would be for the staff, but it might be worth discussing for next year.



#### Items for future planning:

- 2023 Auction
- Grade 6 leaving ceremony
- Grade 6 year-end field trip?
  - It is possible to rent OCTranspo bus instead of school bus? Details are here (https://www.octranspo.com/en/our-services/bus-o-train-network/service-types/charters) and maybe there's a way to get a discount for a school.
  - Depending on how many Grade 6 kids we have, a double decker might be able to bring all the classes together and the added bonus of giving them an idea of what bussing to school will be like next year.
  - I have a contact at the Canada Aviation and Space Museum and could see how deep the ticket discounts could be.
  - Amy had suggested allowing the Grade 6 students to run a Subway lunch day to raise money for a year end trip which I think would be great.

### End of year BBQ

- Some suggestions for the year end BBQ included food trucks and Katie suggested Holmespun Ice Cream and/or Le Donut as options. It would be nice to support local businesses and let students/guests buy a treat.
  - Holmespun used to do a fundraiser where 10% of the profit goes back to the school, which could be a nice bonus.

#### Food for thought:

- There is \$10,869.46 set aside for the kinder yard improvement and \$1,906.08 for the outdoor learning centre.
  - Not necessarily for this year, but it might be valuable to survey the educators to see If there is anything lacking from the improvements that we could help support.
  - If we go ahead with the grant for an Indigenous medicine garden, we could augment that with some of the funds allocated for the outdoor learning centre.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTE:**

We will need a Treasurer for next year since I will no longer have a child in the school.
