Kindergarten Students **MUST** be met at their stop!

OSTA reminds parents/guardians of their responsibility to meet their KG child at their stop every day, or to notify the school of the alternate responsible person who will be meeting their child daily. Failure to meet your child may result in inordinately long bus rides, or dropping the child back at the school or at the nearest police station. Failure to meet the child at the stop may also lead to termination of transportation privileges.

Any requests for changes, reporting of concerns, and sharing of comments should be sent via the [Transportation Issue Form](#), as these are prioritized over emails. This includes: Bus stop changes, driver issues, late buses, hazards, etc. Bus stop changes will only be addressed after October 1.

Empty Seats/Courtesy Seating – **Not in effect until October 1**

OSTA is responsible for processing and approving all empty seat requests after October 1. **Please DO NOT place your child on a bus** until s/he has been assigned to a stop. Your child's safety, and that of other students, could be compromised.
